Station 0: where appropriate IWSS - Puzzle

Station 1: Time journey North Sea coast

- 7 "map carriers" each receive a map of the North Sea, hold them with the map facing forward in front of their chest.
- The rest of the group tries to place the "map carriers" in the right order of development of the North Sea.
- After the group has reached a consensus, the "map carriers" declare their age and if necessary change their position.
- The "map carriers" read the text on the back of their maps.

Analysis: Compare the map eras with the changing sea level curve (see pocket chart).

Station 2: Witness interviews

- Every 2 participants receives a witness bag.
- They read through the question and answer cards and if desired match them to their coastal maps.
- The groups present, in order, their interviews.

- During the interviews the appropriate object is passed around.

Analysis: The witnesses should show in which of the coastal maps they are to be found.
Request all participants in the future to search and find all the witnesses on the beach.

Station 3: Regional time journey

- The stations 1 and 2 should be repeated with the 3 regional coastal maps and corresponding witnesses.

Station 4: Future coast

- 4 small groups sketch their ideal vision of coastal development of the future from the perspective of coastal protectionists, nature conservationists, tourist managers and farmers (land reclamation, nature protection, hotel development...).
- The visions should be documented on the flip chart paper and presented.

Analysis: Compare the various visions.
Determine the common aspects and choose the "best" vision model.
